

WAKONSE GLOSSARY

- CHALLENGE COURSE:** place where true and sometimes unusual experiential learning occurs.
- CHAUTAUQUA:** allows exhibition of the diverse "talents" of Wakonse Fellows and promotes team building and group cohesiveness.
- CHURCH OF THE DUNES:** rustic outdoor church facility.
- CLAYBANKS POTTERY STUDIO AND SHOWROOM:** destination for afternoon tours.
- COMMUNITY FORUM:** gathering of the entire Wakonse community to present and share knowledge, ideas, and experiences of topics of universal interest.
- COMPTON:** one of two major living units near the lake.
- CONFERENCE DISCUSSION GROUPS:** breakout sessions in which small groups discuss topics from the Community Forum.
- DDL (Donald Danforth Leadership Center):** conference center with telephones and small meeting rooms.
- DINING LODGE:** rustic dining lodge with fireplace and camp ambience.
- FELLOWSHIP CENTER:** small rustic meeting place with a central fireplace next to dining lodge.
- FOUR SEASONS:** a more modern facility for large and small group meetings near camp entrance.
- GREY'S DECK:** gathering spot for the afternoon sun or for the sunsets over lake Michigan.
- MARIE SHAVER CENTER:** music practice and small group meeting room in a wonderful location with a spectacular view.
- OLD BALDY:** the "mountain" at Camp Miniwanca.
- POTAWATAMI TRAIL:** a trail of historical significance to Native Americans and used as a short cut to and from Dining Lodge, Four Seasons, and the Quest.
- SEAY:** the other major living unit near the Lake.
- STONY LAKE YACHT CLUB:** where the night is lengthened.
- THE QUEST:** a ritual practiced by some Wakonse Fellows that lengthens the hours of a night.
- UPPER TIPI:** large meeting room with scenic murals, fireplace and overlook of Grey's Deck and Lake Michigan.
- WAKONSE:** to teach, to inspire (Lakota Indian language).
- WEST CAMP:** site of the Wakonse Conference at Camp Miniwanca.
- WORKSHOPS:** presentations that emphasize skill building or provide teaching demonstrations.
